

**California Transparency in Supply Chains Act Disclosure Statement**

The Clorox Company has programs to effectively manage the risks of slavery and trafficking in our supply chain.

Our Supplier Code of Conduct (“Supplier Code”) addresses business practices of our third-party suppliers, their parent companies and affiliates. Our Supplier Code, based on the International Labour Organization (ILO) Core Labor Conventions established by the tripartite UN-affiliated agency, contains specific provisions addressing human rights and labor.

Our suppliers must self-certify their compliance with our Supplier Code and designate management staff to monitor their factories, production facilities and compliance with our Supplier Code. Our supply agreements also contain representations that our suppliers are in compliance with all applicable federal, state and/or provincial, regional, municipal, and local laws, codes, regulations, rules, ordinances, decrees, permits, registrations and orders, which would include laws addressing human trafficking and slavery. In addition, Clorox may conduct announced/unannounced visits and/or have third-party monitor visits to ensure compliance with the Supplier Code.

The Clorox Compliance Hotline, available to all employees, directors and contractors, as well as our suppliers, their employees or their subcontractors, enables the reporting of any noncompliance by Clorox’s suppliers, their employees or subcontractors. Clorox employees who do not act promptly to report noncompliance matters may be subject to disciplinary action.

We provide all non-production employees regular training regarding compliance with the Clorox Code of Conduct, which also includes provisions prohibiting the use of forced labor. We are designing, with plans to implement in 2012, additional training related to identifying and addressing risks of slavery and trafficking in our supply chain.

Finally, as part of our corporate quality management program, we evaluate our supply chains for risk, including human rights and labor risks such as trafficking and slavery. In the event concerns arise, we would investigate the matter and take appropriate actions to mitigate the risk and ensure our supplier was in compliance with our Supplier Code.
