Clorox's former CEO, Robert Shetterly, worked with young people in East Oakland to envision what would eventually become EOYDC. Mr. Shetterly also saw to it that Clorox provided seed funding to bring the shared vision to life.

To date, The Clorox Company Foundation has awarded more than \$3.5 million in grants to EOYDC.

Allies For Racial Justice The Clorox Company Foundation's commitment to racial justice is unwavering. The foundation has taken a comprehensive approach to our racial justice portfolio with the intention of lasting change. The grants we've awarded in this area encompass a range of critical areas, each aimed at dismantling systemic inequities and creating a more inclusive future for all.

By supporting projects like this, we strive to make a meaningful and positive impact on the lives of marginalized communities, advancing racial equity. As part of our ongoing commitment to racial justice, we have provided support to organizations that offer programming in the following areas:

 Supporting organizations that offer technical assistance, capacity building, and capital contributes to narrowing the wealth gap and creating sustainable economic opportunities within the Black community.



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Spreading Roots for Environmental Justice Grounded in the belief that wellness is a fundamental human right, The Clorox Company Foundation is driven by a mission to foster healthy and inclusive communities. Central to this vision is the recognition that environmental factors play a crucial role in perpetuating disparities. With a strong commitment to environmental justice, we focus on supporting initiatives that address these inequities and prioritize the well-being of impacted frontline communities.

The Healthy Parks Project embodies our dedication to advancing environmental justice. This program aims to enhance community parks and increase access to green spaces in underserved and underrepresented communities. As a testament to our commitment, we awarded two grants in fiscal year 2023 to advance this important work. Our aspiration to expand the Healthy Parks Project's reach to additional regions, including Atlanta, Georgia, and Durham, North Carolina, came to fruition this year: we are pleased to partner with Park Pride in Atlanta and Durham Parks Foundation in the Durham area. By investing in these communities, we aim to create a more equitable landscape, where people can thrive and enjoy the benefits of a healthier and greener environment.

The Gift of a Brighter Tomorrow At Clorox, fostering a culture of giving back is deeply encouraged through our workplace giving program, Getting Involved for Tomorrow (GIFT). This initiative empowers teammates to support causes they are passionate about and make a positive impact in their communities. Through GIFT, The Clorox Company Foundation goes the extra mile by matching employee donations to the charities of their choice, dollar-for-dollar, with a generous annual limit of \$2,500 per teammate.

The impact of this program is truly remarkable. In 2022, we are proud that more than half of our teammates participated in GIFT donating \$4.75M to 4,500 nonprofit organizations, the highest number of organizations on record. This inspiring level of engagement illustrates the enduring commitment of Clorox teammates to uplift and support their local communities.

Our employees volunteered 127,000 hours in calendar year 2022 - valued at more than \$4 million* to causes that are meaningful to them.

*The financial equivalent is determined using a rate of \$31.80 per volunteer hour. This is based on the 2022 industry standard from Independent Sector, a leading nonprofit organization that determines the financial equivalent for a variety of volunteer initiatives. Less than 5 percent of these hours are from employees outside the U.S., but all areas are calculated using the U.S. rate. **Volunteering to Give Back** At Clorox, we wholeheartedly embrace and support employee volunteerism, recognizing the value it brings to both our teammates and the communities we serve. We encourage our employees to engage in causes they are passionate about, fostering a culture of giving back that remains integral to our company's values.

To honor and appreciate the efforts of our dedicated volunteers, we offer volunteer rewards. For every hour our teammates spend volunteering outside of work, they receive \$10, allowing them to contribute up to \$300 annually to the nonprofit organization of their choice.

Furthermore, we are committed to educating all our teammates about the cause areas supported by The Clorox Company Foundation. This commitment goes beyond just financial contributions. We believe in making a tangible impact, "Beyond the Check", through hands-on or skills-based volunteer programs. Through these initiatives, both individuals and teams can actively participate, lending their expertise and time to causes that resonate with them.

Organizations such as the Asian Pacific Fund and The Mosaic Project are dedicated to creating and fostering safe and affirming environments for all people within their communities.

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All Hands in When it Matters We take immense pride in our steadfast commitment to providing swift, meaningful, and distinctive aid to communities facing emergencies. During times of disaster, bleach is among the most sought-after items, second only to water. For over 50 years, we have been a dedicated supporter of the American Red Cross, actively participating in their Annual Disaster Giving Program and contributing over \$1 million in donations.

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As part of our longstanding relationship with American Red Cross, we awarded the Bay Area chapter with a \$200,000 grant to support their Home Fire Financial Assistance program. This program addresses the immediate needs of home fire survivors from lodging to clothing to replacement of prescriptions.

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> These examples reflect our genuine commitment to making a positive impact during times of crisis and supporting communities when they need it most. As a company, we remain dedicated to leveraging our resources and expertise to help those facing emergencies, providing aid that truly matters.

In the past year, our disaster relief efforts have made a tangible difference in multiple areas:

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- Collaborating with the American Red Cross, we supplied Glad bags, Clorox Disinfecting Wipes, Bleach, and other disinfecting products to their facilities nationwide, supporting their vital disaster relief operations.
- After a severe hurricane season in 2022, our Professional Products business joined forces with AmeriCares, Feeding America, and Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) to make a substantial impact. We donated and distributed numerous truckloads of CloroxPro disinfectants to areas in Kentucky and Florida impacted by the hurricanes and floods.
- We provided ready-to-use bleach products to Mississippi during the water crisis, as well as Turkey and Syria in the wake of the 2023 earthquake.
